

Since 2011, he has made 16 trips to biblical lands, capturing photos and videos to support his teaching and study.

Dan is actively involved with Appian Media, a nonprofit organization that produces free online Bible documentaries. He also co-hosts a podcast on biblical topics called *Digging Deeper*.



THE INTINERARY:

MONDAY, MAY 18 - DEPART FROM NEW YORK CITY

Depart the US from New York City in the early evening for an overnight transatlantic flight. Dinner and Breakfast will be served on the plane en route to Istanbul.

TUESDAY, MAY 19- ISTANBUL

Arrive in Istanbul (formerly Constantinople/Byzantium), the city that spans the Bosporus and is in two continents. Capitol of the Eastern half of the Roman Empire, and major city during the first millennia of the church. We will meet our guide and travel to the hotel for dinner and overnight.

WEDNESDAY, MAY 20 - ISTANBUL

A full day of sightseeing in Istanbul will include the Sultan Ahmed Mosque (Blue Mosque), Hagia Sophia (Rebuilt by Justinian and the largest cathedral in the world for 1000 years), Topkapi Palace (former home of the Sultans and now a museum with priceless jewels), and a boat ride on the Bosporus. A visit to the Istanbul Archaeological Museum will reveal many artifacts of Biblical interest. The Grand Bazaar will give a chance for souvenir shopping as there are over 400 shops on 61 covered streets

THURSDAY, MAY 21 - ISTANBUL AND IZMIR

A morning flight to Izmir begins the tour of the cities of the seven churches of Revelation. A tour of Izmir, Smyrna of the New Testament, will include Mount Pagos that overlooks the city, the Archeological excavations including the Agora, and the Izmir Archaeological Museum. Artifacts at the museum include a runner wearing a wreath and Flavius Damianus, an imperial priest wearing a diadem.

FRIDAY, MAY 22 - PERGAMUM, THYATIRA, AND IZMIR

After breakfast, drive to Pergamum to visit the Acropolis with its many temples and buildings including the altar of Zeus, the temple of Athena, the library, the temple of Trajan, and theater (steepest in the world). We will then visit the Asclepieum, an important medical center of the ancient world, and the Pergamum archaeological museum. The day will end with a trip to the archaeological park at Thyatira (home of Lydia, the first convert in Europe) to see the few remains and then back to Izmir for dinner and overnight.



SATURDAY, MAY 23 - SARDIS, PHILADELPHIA, LAODICEA, COLOSSAE, AND PAMUKKALE

Drive to Sardis, the capitol of ancient Lydia, where you can view the temple of Artemis, a reconstructed synagogue and gymnasium. Next travel to Philadelphia, built on the slopes of Mount Tmolus. After crossing the mountains, we will view the tell of Colossae at the foot of Mount Cadmus, then travel a few miles west to Laodicea. Excavations are still underway there, allowing one to view the theater, stadium, aqueduct, and water terminals. Overnight in Pamukkale, site of Biblical Hierapolis and its fascinating white limestone terraces.

SUNDAY, MAY 24 - HIERAPOLIS, APHRODISIAS, AND KUSADASI

After an opportunity to worship, spend time in Hierapolis where you can view the archaeological remains of the necropolis, amphitheater, gymnasium,



baths, or just spend the time exploring the hot mineral springs. Then travel back west to Aphrodisias where National Geographic excavated for over 30 years and one can see a remarkably wellpreserved stadium, theater, Odeon, baths and sculptures in the onsite museum. Overnight in Kusadasi, a resort city on the Aegean coast.

MONDAY, MAY 25 - EPHESUS, MILETUS, AND KUSADASI

Travel to Ephesus with its impressive remains of the Temple of Hadrian, Temple of Domitian, Celsus Library, Agora, harbor, Theater (site of the riot from Acts 19), Temple of Diana (one of the Seven Wonders of the Ancient World), and the Archaeological Museum of Seljuk with its statues of Diana. Next is a stop at Miletus where Paul met with the Ephesian elders at the end of his third journey. The Lion harbor, agora, impressive theater can all be viewed. Then back to Kusadasi for dinner and overnight.



TUESDAY, MAY 26 - BEGIN GREEK ISLAND CRUISE AND PATMOS

Board your Celestyal Cruise line ship for a four-day/three-night cruise of the Aegean and Greek Islands. The first stop will be the island of Patmos, where John was exiled and penned Revelation. Optional excursions include the traditional cave of the Apocalypse and Monastery of St. John.



WEDNESDAY, MAY 27- RHODES

Rhodes is known as a place Paul stopped during his travel back from his third journey, where Herod the Great stopped several times, and a trading partner of Tyre. Optional excursions include a fortymile scenic bus ride from the harbor to the town of Lindos will allow us to see the impressive Acropolis, where the temple site was protected by a 400-foot drop to the ocean. After returning to Rhodes, a tour of the city will occur prior to some free time and returning to the ship.

THURSDAY, MAY 28 - CRETE AND SANTORINI

The morning starts in Crete with an optional excursion to the palace of Knossos, home to King Minos, and site of the Labyrinth. Later sail to Santorini, where optional excursions to the amazing island should not be missed. The current six islands were formed from one after a volcanic eruption around 3600 years ago. The cities cling to the sides of the caldera and present many photographic opportunities.

FRIDAY, MAY 29 - ATHENS

Arrive at the port in Athens in the morning. A tour of Athens will include the Temple of Zeus, stadium, Theater of Dionysius, Mars Hill, Acropolis, Parthenon, the Agora, Socrates Prison and the National Archaeological Museum.

SATURDAY, MAY 30 - CORINTH AND ATHENS

After breakfast, a drive across the Isthmus and Corinth Canal connecting the Ionian and Aegean Seas will lead us to the ancient site of Corinth. Paul stayed here three years working with Aquilla and Priscilla. You can see the Agora, bema (where Paul was brought before Gallio), Temple of Apollo, Fountain of Peirene, and first-century shops. After lunch we will try to visit the port of Cenchrea, used by Paul and home of Phoebe, as well as Isthmia, home of the Isthmian games.



SUNDAY, MAY 31 - ATHENS

After an opportunity to worship, the rest of the day will be free for leisure activities, personal shopping, and sightseeing.

MONDAY, JUNE 1 – ATHENS TO NEW YORK CITY

Travel to the airport in Athens for the flight home, after spending two weeks with a group who have become good friends, traveling much of the territory that Paul and John worked. The flight will give you time to process the deeper meaning and understanding you will have when you read these passages of the scriptures.
